1. Context and Justification

African Parks is a non-profit conservation organisation that assumes full responsibility for the rehabilitation and long-term management of national parks in partnership with governments and local communities. We currently manage 24 national parks and protected areas in 13 countries covering more than 20 million hectares: Angola, Benin, Central African Republic, Chad, Democratic Republic of Congo, Ethiopia, Malawi, Mozambique, Republic of Congo, Rwanda, South Sudan, Zambia, and Zimbabwe. Since 2017, the Beninese government has entered into a long-term agreement with African Parks to revitalise, rehabilitate, and develop the Pendjari and W national parks. Together, these two parks form an important part of the W-Arly-Pendjari (WAP) complex, a transboundary landscape of global importance representing the largest intact wild ecosystem in West Africa.

To enhance operational security, African Parks is implementing an integrated Security Technology Enhancement Programme across both parks. The programme aims to strengthen the parks' ability to prevent, detect, assess and respond to security threats through the deployment of advanced technologies, including early warning systems, surveillance solutions, radar, ground sensors, drone and counter-drone capabilities, access control, command-and-control infrastructure, night vision technologies and other integrated security systems. Wherever operationally feasible, these technologies should also contribute to broader conservation objectives, including wildlife protection, ecological monitoring, law enforcement effectiveness and operational decision-making.

To support the successful delivery of this programme, African Parks is recruiting a Senior Security Technology Consultant to provide independent technical expertise throughout the assessment, solution design and implementation of the programme. The objective is to establish a sustainable Security Technology capability supported by appropriate governance, effective supplier support arrangements and empowered internal Technology teams.

The consultant will assess operational requirements, recommend appropriate technologies, support supplier selection, define technical standards, oversee system integration and technical acceptance, facilitate the recruitment and technical onboarding of a permanent Security Technology Lead, and deliver a comprehensive knowledge transfer programme for African Parks' Technology teams.

By the completion of the consultancy, African Parks should possess a fully implemented, documented and supportable Security Technology capability, with appropriate maintenance arrangements in place, enabling the Security Technology Lead and the Technology teams to sustainably supervise, operate and maintain the deployed systems.

2. Objective of the Assignment

The Senior Security Technology Consultant will provide independent technical expertise to support the assessment, design and implementation of an integrated Security Technology capability across Pendjari and W National Parks.

Working closely with Park Management, the Technology teams and other key stakeholders, the consultant will guide technology decisions, support the selection and integration of appropriate solutions, and ensure that the program delivers a sustainable capability aligned with African Parks' operational security and conservation objectives. The consultant will also conduct financial feasibility assessments of proposed solutions to support decision-making and ensure that selected options are practical, sustainable, and represent good value for money.

The consultant will also support the establishment of the governance, supplier support arrangements and knowledge transfer mechanisms required to ensure the long-term sustainability of the deployed capability. The assignment will conclude with the successful implementation, technical acceptance and handover of the Security Technology capability to the permanent Security Technology Lead, supported by African Parks' Technology teams and qualified suppliers.

The successful candidate should demonstrate sound technical judgement, proven experience in comparable security technology programs, and the ability to deliver practical solutions in demanding operational environments.

3. Key Deliverables

The Consultant will be responsible for the following key tasks:

1. **Assessment & Design:** Assess operational requirements and develop the Security Technology architecture, implementation roadmap, and strategic recommendations.
2. **Financial Feasibility:** Assess the financial feasibility of proposed solutions, ensuring they are not only functional and applicable, but also cost-effective, aligned with available budget, and represent good value for money.
3. **Recruitment Support:** Support the recruitment and early technical onboarding of the permanent Security Technology Lead.
4. **Procurement Support:** In coordination with the Security Technology Lead, support the evaluation of technology solutions and suppliers, and develop the technical specifications and evaluation criteria required for procurement.
5. **Implementation:** Support the Security Technology Lead in overseeing system integration, testing, and technical acceptance. Ensure Control Rooms in both parks are designed, implemented, and fully operational to required standards.
6. **Governance & Handover:** Establish the governance, documentation, supplier maintenance/support arrangements, and knowledge transfer required for long-term sustainability. Ensure the successful handover of a fully operational, integrated and documented Security Technology capability to the Security Lead, supported by African Parks's Technology teams and qualified suppliers.

Payments will be milestone-based upon the satisfactory reception and written approval of each deliverable by the Park Managers. A Schedule of Payments will be incorporated into the contract during the awarding phase.

6. Required Qualifications and Experience

6.1 Academic Background

- **Master's Degree (or higher)** in Telecommunications Engineering, Electronics, Embedded Systems, Network Security, Defense/Military Technologies, Cybersecurity, or a highly related technical field.
- Advanced technical certifications in relevant fields (e.g., CISSP, drone piloting/operations, RF engineering) are highly desirable.

6.2 Professional Experience

- **Minimum 10 years of experience** at a senior level in one or more of the following fields: critical infrastructure security, advanced surveillance systems, defence technology, telecommunications, cybersecurity, or drone/anti-drone systems.
- Proven experience leading or providing technical oversight for complex security technology programmes involving multiple technologies, suppliers and stakeholders.
- Experience as a security technology specialist, or in specialised roles such as electronic warfare, cybersecurity, or intelligence systems.
- Practical experience with one or more of the following technologies: radar, drone and counter-drone systems, surveillance systems, ground sensors, ISR or command-and-control platforms.
- Experience working in Africa, particularly in West Africa, is strongly appreciated.
- Experience with complex multi-stakeholder engagements.

6.3 Technical Skills

- Demonstrated experience in advanced surveillance, detection, and security systems.
- Strong knowledge of UAV/UAS systems and counter-drone solutions (C-UAS).
- Proficiency in RF detection, signal processing and ground sensor systems.
- Knowledge of AI-based surveillance and analysis solutions.
- Experience with command and control (C2) systems and operational centres.
- Familiarity with geolocation, GIS, multi-sensor data fusion, and satellite technologies.
- Strong understanding of cybersecurity in the context of critical infrastructure.
- Strong stakeholder engagement and communication skills

Note on Proof of Experience

Given the senior and highly specialised nature of this consultancy, candidates will be required to provide verifiable evidence of relevant professional experience, including detailed CVs, project references and documentation demonstrating successful delivery of comparable security technology programmes.

7. Evaluation Criteria and Selection Method

Selection will follow the Quality and Cost-Based Selection (QCBS) method (Technical: 80% / Financial: 20%). A minimum technical score of **70 out of 100 points** is required to qualify for the financial evaluation.

7.2 Financial Evaluation (Weight: 20%)

The lowest qualified financial proposal (F_m) receives 100 financial points. Other proposals (F) are scored as follows:

The final combined score is calculated as:

$$\text{Total Score} = (\text{Technical Score} \times 0.80) + (\text{Financial Score} \times 0.20)$$
